Description of necessary first aid measures

Precautions for safe handling

Keep containers tightly closed as product is hygroscopic (absorbs water). Handle and open containers with care in a well-ventilated area. Do not empty into drains.

Store in a cool, well-ventilated area, away from sunlight, ignition sources and other sources of heat. Do not store near strong oxidisers.
